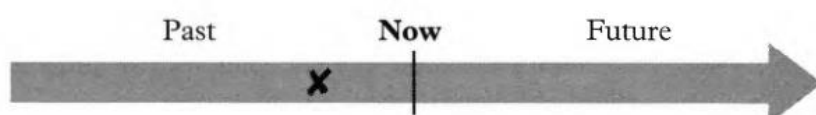

Answer 1

The chef phoned because he couldn't come (because of a family emergency)

1. Did the chef phone in the past or now? In the past.
2. Is the chef phoning now? No.
3. Did the chef call before or after he couldn't come? Before
4. Was the chef able to come? No.
5. Did the chef give a reason for not coming? Yes, he phoned to explain.



Regular verbs all end in -ed.

He walked to school.

✚ We make regular past simple verbs by adding **-ed** to the base form.

walk -> walked, turn -> turned, watch -> watched

✚ We add **-d** for verbs that already end in -e,

like -> liked, waste -> wasted, believe -> believed

✚ We double the consonant:

- if the base form ends in a single vowel + single consonant.

EX: fit---- **fitted**, stop ---- **stopped**

- If verbs ending consonant + -y, change the -y to -i, add -ed

EX: study---- **studied**, try----- **tried**

Past simple: negative

She ~~didn't~~ ~~worked~~ in the City.

~~Did~~ she ~~worked~~ in the City?

<i>I / You / He / She / It We / They</i>	+	<i>didn't / (did not)</i>	+	base form verb
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Past simple: questions

Yes / No questions				
<i>Did / Didn't</i>	+	<i>I / you / he / she / it / we / they</i>	+	base form verb

Did you finish that book?

NOT ~~Did you finished that book?~~

Wh- questions

Where / Why / Who / When / How long etc	+	did / didn't	+	I / you / he / she / it / we / they	+	base form verb
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When did she pass her exams?

Pronunciation:

The -ed ending can be pronounced in three different ways:

- 1- /id/ wanted, waited, waded (after /d/, /t/)
- 2- /t/ walked, coughed, flicked (after /f/, /k/, /pi/, /s/, ///, /tʃ/)
- 3- /d/ stirred, fired, signed (after all other sounds)

Ed ending of regular verbs

/ d / all other sounds	/ t / unvoiced: p, k, s, f, th, ch, sh	/ ɪd / d and t sounds.
